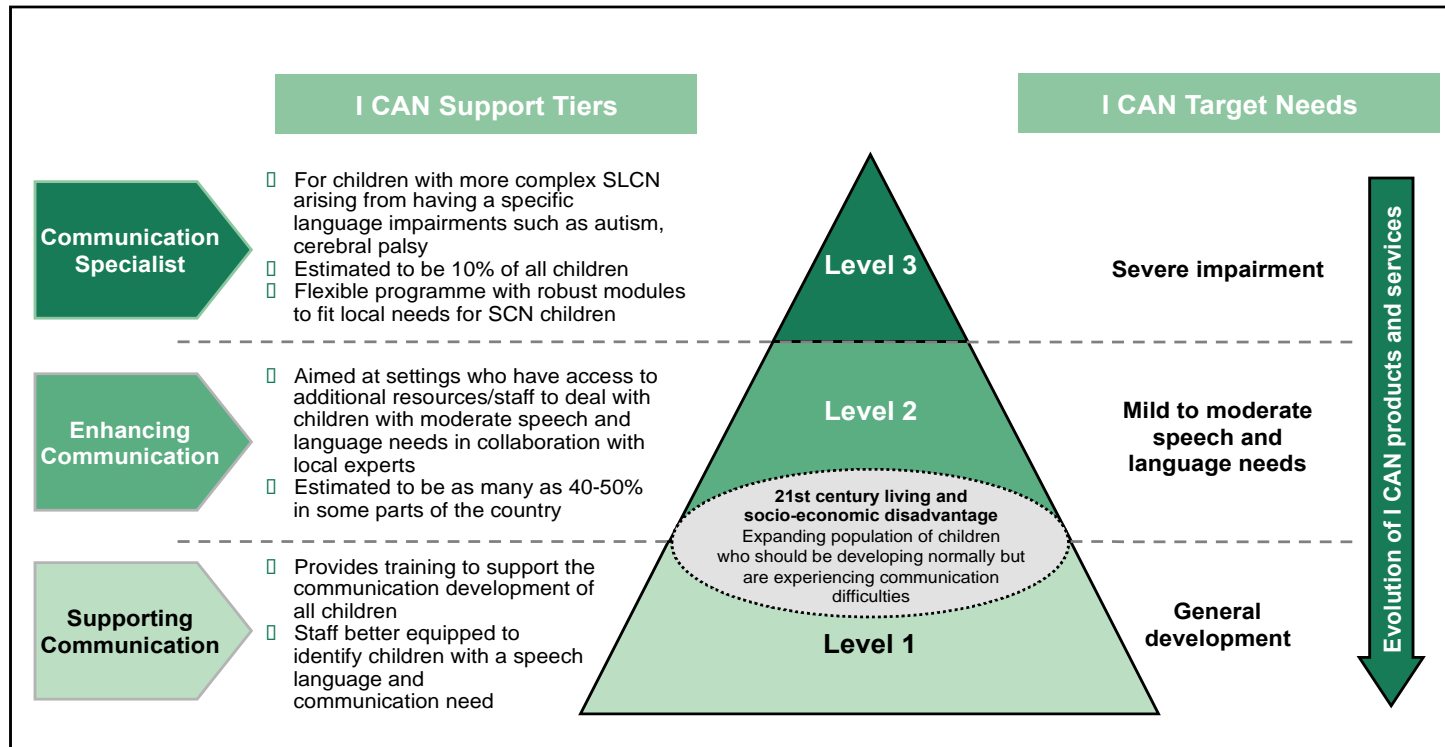
Language skills impact on:

- Attainment
- Behaviour and wellbeing
- Narrowing the gap

Speech Language and Communication Needs (SLCN) predict poor life chances

- Only 25% of children with SLCN reach expected levels for English and maths at age 11
- Only 6% get five good GCSEs including English and Maths
- Two thirds of 7-14 year olds with serious behaviour problems have language impairment
- Two thirds of young offenders have language difficulties

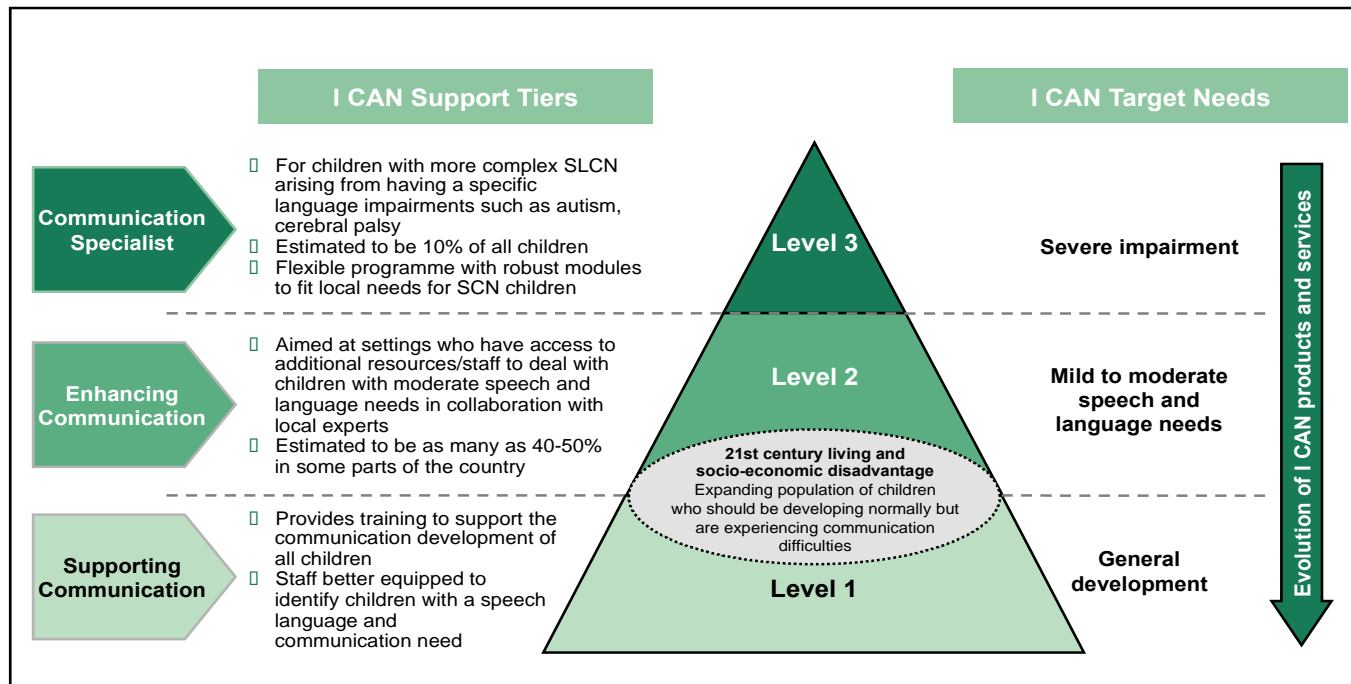


I CAN Early Intervention

Case Study: Kent

- Developed flexibly in partnership with Kent County Council and PCT
- Targets children under 5 with SLCN
- Parents as co-educators
- Kent services accredited by I CAN
- Positive Social Return on Investment
- Part of I CAN's wider 'Early Talk' programme

Case Study: Kent

Two models:

- Ashford Better Communication (ABC)
- Thanet peripatetic service in East Kent

I CAN/Ashford Better Communication

- Sparked by concerns about children who needed to attend a specialist language unit on school entry
- Realisation that conventional speech and language interventions ineffective
- Aim: a more cost effective service that providing smooth transition to local primary schools through early intervention

I CAN/Ashford Better Communication

- Multidisciplinary steering group of parents, SLTs, specialist teacher commissioner and I CAN advisor
- Service targeted at 2-5 year olds
- Parents as co-educators
- Two terms in a specialist nursery linked to a Children's Centre – home nursery place kept open

I CAN/Ashford Better Communication

Results in 2008/9:

- 92 % able to attend their local primary school – making good progress
- 70 % marked increase in comprehension
- 80% increase in their use of language
- Only 1 child out of 12 needed a Statement of SEN
- Both parents and home nurseries increased their confidence and knowledge
- Overall progress across EYFS

I CAN/Ashford Better Communication

Cost effectiveness of early intervention

- £35,000 savings per year when compared to specialist alternatives
- Over the longer term £150,000 savings per child

With this intensive input everything clicked. Within a few weeks he ‘unlocked’ – he found his voice.
